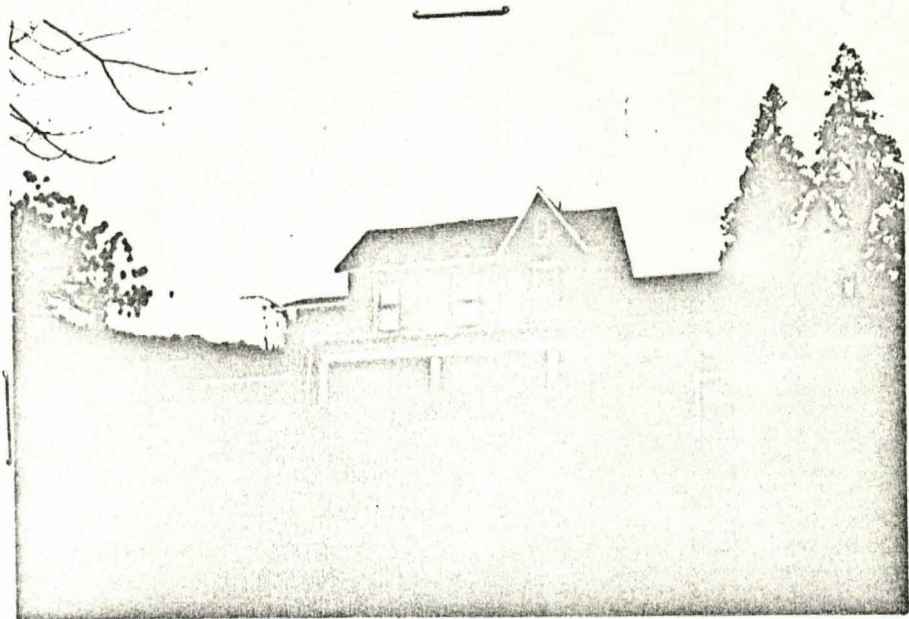
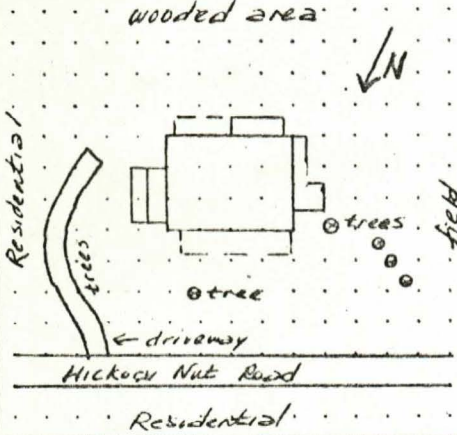

26. brief description (note unusual features, integrity, environment, threats and associated buildings)
 This vernacular 4 Over 4 style structure has an expanded form due to the addition of four wings resulting in an irregular-shaped plan. The main two story section has a gabled roof and one brick central chimney and an off-center, front-facing gable interrupts the roofline. Vertical wood siding with a saw-tooth edge and a small fixed window ornament this gable end. The transomed entranceway is located in the same facade bay. 1/1 sash windows, many framed by louvered shutters, are used in the three bay facade and throughout the house. Brick piers support tapered posts on the wide flat-roofed front porch, a later addition to the structure. A small back porch lies adjacent to the back wing. The 1-1/2 story northwest wing has a facade entrance and a similar appearance as the main section suggesting that they may have been built at the same time. The two story northeast wing was also built prior to 1920. A fourth one-story wing has been recently added to the northeast two-story wing section. An unusual window in the side of the one-story wing is a simple version of an oriel window. Aluminum siding covers the two northeast wing sections. Wood (over)

27. history, significance and/or background

This house was built near the turn-of-the-century when North Apollo Borough was a sparsely settled area. The Burkett family is believed to be the original owner of the single-family dwelling. The 4 Over 4 folk design this house displays, while not immediately recognizable due to four wing sections, is unique in North Apollo's built environment. Research would be necessary to restore the house to its original appearance.
