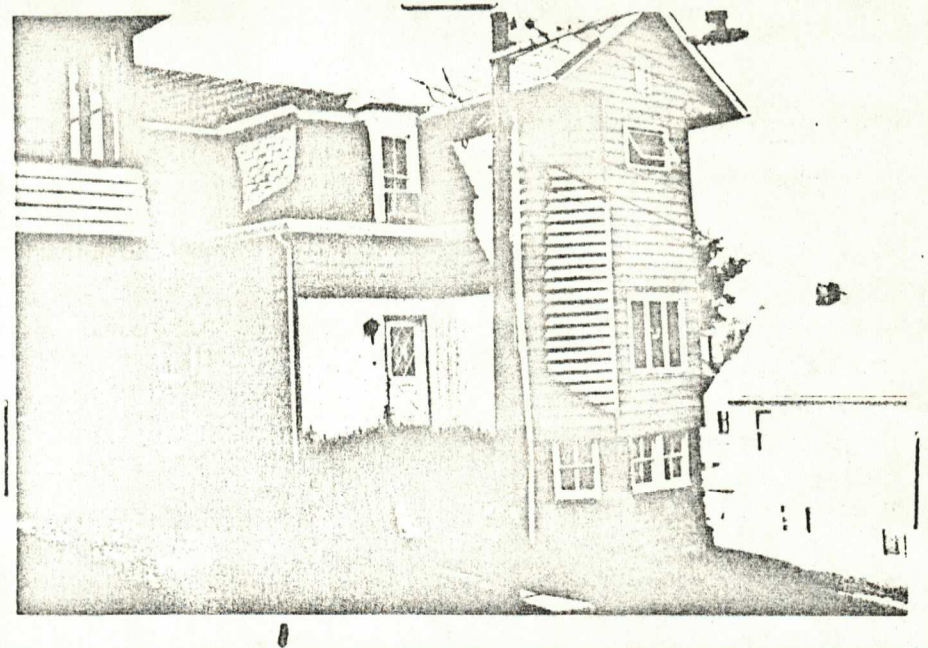
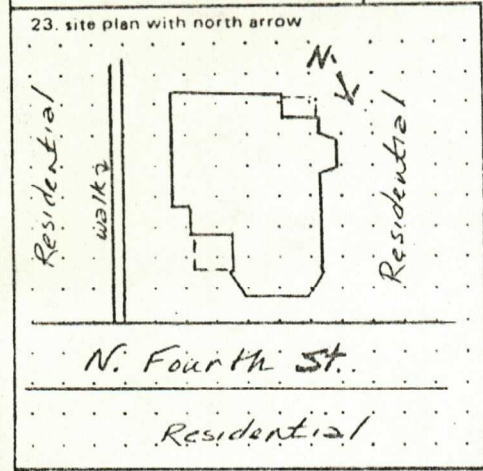

26. brief description (note unusual features, integrity, environment, threats and associated buildings) This two-story, vernacular dwelling has an irregular shape. The basic plan, however, is an ell-shaped, Upright and Wing type. A 1 1-2 story, mansard-roofed section is inset into the "L". The front of the wing section is a 2 1-2 story bay and a one-story bay window is located on the east side. A dormer in the concave mansard roof has an original 2/2 sash window and the original windows remain in the raised basement facade. Various types of sash and casement replacement windows appear throughout the house. The house has a gabled roof, wood frame construction and vinyl siding. There is a small back porch and a front stoop which is in dilapidated condition. The original front door has been replaced. The property is located in an area zoned R-1, Residential, and there are no threats known to the structure.

27. history, significance and/or background This house is a unique variation of the Upright and Wing folk type found throughout Armstrong County. Evidence from several historical maps indicate the building was constructed between 1876 and 1896. This was a population growth period in Apollo Borough generated by development of the railroad and local steel industry. Alterations to the exterior walls, original windows and entranceway have detracted from its integrity. A photograph of the structure taken prior to these alterations would be necessary to execute an accurate restoration. The single-family (over)
